
A LEGAL NEEDS SURVEY IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN: PERSPECTIVES OF LAWYERS AND LEGAL AND NON-LEGAL SERVICE PROVIDERS

Almost half of all Canadians have experienced a justice-related problem, leading to financial hardship, emotional stress, or other health problems. People frequently perceive their legal needs are unmet or their resolutions are unfair.

Percentage of Lawyers and CBO (community based organization) Representatives that Agreed with the Following Statements



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
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The Saskatchewan Legal Needs Survey was completed by :

67 CBOs Focusing on general perspectives of justice-related problems and legal needs, (unmet) legal needs of clients, legal services in demand but not offered in community, barriers to access and demographic groups (under)served.

272 Lawyers Focusing on general perceptions of justice-related problems and legal needs, areas of law, social groups (under)served, clients' legal needs.
